Public notice is hereby given that the Summit County Council will conduct a public hearing to discuss and possibly take action regarding a Special Exception request to allow for an expansion of a non-conforming commercial use/structure and for a decrease in S.R. 224 right-of-way setback, located at located at 4459 S.R. 224, Summit County, UT 84098. The public hearing will be held:

The applicant, Grady Kohler, is seeking two Special Exceptions which would allow for construction of a new 2,980 sq. ft. (approx.) greenhouse at the Park City Nursery, located at 4459 S.R. 224, Summit County, UT 84098.

The applicant is seeking County Council approval for a Special Exception from Section 10-8-1(C) of the Snyderville Basin Development Code to allow for an expansion of a non-conforming commercial use/structure, currently prohibited by the Development Code.

The applicant is also seeking County Council approval for a Special Exception from Section 10-2-5(E.2) of the Snyderville Basin Development Code to allow for the proposed greenhouse to be constructed 8 feet from the S.R. 224 right-of-way, opposed to the 100-foot setback requirement.
