



PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

Camp Oakley Conditional Use Permit Amendment Mile 4.7, Weber Canyon, Summit County, UT

Public notice is hereby given that the Eastern Summit County Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing to discuss and possibly take action regarding a Conditional Use Permit Amendment for Camp Oakley. The public hearing will be held:

The applicant, Paul Feser, is requesting to receive approval for an amendment to the original Camp Oakley Conditional Use Permit. As part of the request the applicant is requesting to incorporate Parcel SCLR-6A-1AM-X (8.73 acres) into the Camp Oakley Conditional Use Permit for operations purposes, add a 3,200 sq. ft. horse stable with temporary living quarters above (1,280 sq. ft. to allow owners of animals to care for them overnight) on Parcel CD-195-X (adjacent to Parcel SCLR-6A-1AM-X), and add two garages/storage buildings and a residence (caretaker's cabin) on Parcel SCLR-6A-1 AM-X as per Exhibit A of this Staff Report.

The applicant is not seeking additional visitor capacity beyond the existing Camp Oakley Conditional Use Permit which is 330 persons, including staff and/or supervisors with a maximum overnight capacity of Camp Oakley of 264 persons, including staff and/or supervisors. This capacity limitation would apply to Parcel SCLR-6A-1AM-X.
