

Summit County RAP Recreation Committee  
Meeting Minutes  
November 21, 2022

Work session called to order at 1:12 by Amy Yost and second by Keren Mazanec

Purpose of meeting to discuss applications received by committee. At last meeting applications were divided among members and today members will discuss in length the applications they reviewed.

Jessica discussed Francis City Playground Equipment application. ADA group had been involved before and are they going to contribute this time? Jessica will ask.

Jessica discussed Summit Community Gardens - Miss Billie's Garden Classroom Phase 2. No bids in application. Keren asked a question regarding who owns the property. Summit county owns land, Basin Rec helps manage, Summit Land Conservancy involved and land cannot be developed.

Breke brought up the code regarding who could apply for RAP tax grants.

A discussion was revisited about the code present in the statues for the state and county regarding definitions of entities that qualify for RAP tax grants. This may be found at [www.utah.gov/xcode/Title59](http://www.utah.gov/xcode/Title59)

Code #8 states that the entity must be publicly owned or operated and it must support recreation.

Questions were asked about the status of UOP.

Amy Yost requests PCSSA is notified as soon as possible that they do not qualify. Amy J will reach out to Linda to make sure this has happened.

Amy Y and David to send a letter to N. Summit that they lacked an application. Breke brought up the point that we motioned in last meeting to disqualify their application but they actually did not even present an application.

David spoke about the Henefer application for facility improvements. We are waiting on 2 more bids. It was also noted that they did not ask for the full amount.

David spoke about the PC Ice Arena's ask for improved bathrooms. Keren suggested they research the products so that they have materials that will not easily break considering the number of kids and skates that go through the bathrooms. David will ask them more questions about the products they are looking at.

Breke discussed Mountain Trails Foundation ask for Trail Counters. PC municipal has the same counters and they have done well for them. No bids. More visuals would be helpful in both MTF applications. Jessica brought up the question as to why PC municipal is not submitting the application instead of MTF since PC gives MTF the authority to make the trails and mark them. Jessica noted that Basin Rec also uses counters, a different type, and now

MTF would be the 3rd entity with trail counters and is all the information going to be managed in the same software and compatible so it can be used best.

Breke discussed MTF application for signs and maps. Again it would be helpful to have more visuals so we can see what the maps and signs would look like.

Len discussed the Peoa application. It was incomplete. Len will reach out to them to discuss further.

Len discussed the Oakley City application for the Weber River Corridor. He is to do a walk through next week with the applicant. The application was done well with 3 bids for everything.

Keren discussed the Park City Municipal Golf Club's ask for 2 Green Mowers. Keren discussed the questions she had and the answers received from Tony Larsen.

Keren discussed the Snyderville Basin Special Recreation District's ask for shading for Willow Creek Park Courts. Ian asked for more photos of the area and the shade proposed. Keren will ask the applicant.

Ian discussed Park City Municipal Parks and Recreation request for ball netting for the turf field at Quinn's complex. He said it will be 15' high but the ground is lower than the parking lot so it will only be 11' in sight line. The netting will be tight enough to catch a lacrosse ball as well. He had some wildlife concerns that Jessica Moran said she would look into. Keren asked for a photo or map of the area so the committee can see how the field is situated in comparison to the parking lot and look at the other fields.

Ian discussed the Park City Recreation, Park City Municipal ask for acoustic fencing for the pickle ball courts at the MARC. Ian described the panels, that the MARC would take them down in the winter, they can be repositioned and they have a life expectancy of 15 years. Keren asked why they picked black instead of green. Keren brought up the question of if they had spoken to the HOA or the residents that will be affected by this area. Keren mentioned that it would be nice to have something in writing that says the residence agree with putting up these panels to decrease the sound. Ian will ask the applicant about this.

Amy discussed the Park City Miners Baseball Foundation request for turf fields. There is a big difference between what they are asking and what the bid says it will cost. We also question the \$100,000 of RAP tax they have in operating budget. Amy will ask the applicant for a revised budget. Keren had many questions regarding who owns the land, how the district is involved and where other funds are going to come from. We also wondered if they are planning on plowing these fields so they can use them when snow is on the ground. Many of these questions will be asked to the applicant upon interview.

Amy discussed the Snyderville Basin Special Recreation District request for cardio equipment for the field house. There were not bids but they should be emailing Amy some bids.

Once application discussions were concluded we confirmed plans for interviews which will be most of the day on Dec 1&2.

Public Comment: time was left for public comment for approx 5 minutes but no response and no public had signed on during meeting.

Our meeting was closed at 2:54pm by Amy Y. and second by Keren.
