On May 27, 2022 a local resident, Mr. Brooks Glisson, was arrested on suspicion of distributing marijuana contaminated with fentanyl. The presumptive presence of fentanyl was based on preliminary field tests. However, definitive test results obtained from Utah's Forensic Toxicology Laboratory in June, 2022, determined that the marijuana DID NOT contain fentanyl.

Mr. Glisson cooperated with law enforcement investigators once confronted with the possible presence of fentanyl. Based on the totality of circumstances and in the interests of justice, the Summit County Attorney's office will not be filing any charges associated with this incident.

The Summit County Attorney's office would like to remind the public that people are innocent until proven guilty. The Summit County Attorney's Office regrets that Mr. Glisson's name was falsely associated with distribution of fentanyl.
